


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Inspiration for KLHS Vision



Guiding Principles


- All students should have access to a Real World Learning opportunity

- Real World Learning experiences should be informed by what students want and need and what industries in the Kansas City community predict will be the most useful and lucrative positions available.
- Be inclusive of ALL stakeholders at every stage of the process. Everyone has a seat at the table and the space to voice their perspectives.
- RWL opportunities should be worthwhile and useful to students. Students should walk away from each experience with essential skill development, meaningful relationships, and clarity on their next steps. We will be intentional about curating RWL experiences that will lead them towards a goal of living a fulfilling and purposeful life where they can be happy and financially independent.







Snapshot of Student Survey Results

"I have a love / hate relationship with the City. Its very violent so that makes me want to leave."



Snapshot of Family Survey Results




Ideally, what would you like your child/children to do after they graduate HS?

Strategy



Challenges

- Stakeholder apathy and lack of motivation to connect with students in a meaningful way
- Staffing capacity and financial sustainability
- Unforeseen and abrupt changes (i.e. pandemic, war)
- Student's eligibility to pursue opportunities
- Competing priorities of KIPP teachers (capacity), and funding
- Piecing together opportunities for all students when opportunities are limited

Goals

- Primary Goal #1: All KIPP KC Legacy High School students will earn at least one Market Value Asset by the time they graduate with the support of community and business stakeholders.
- Primary Goal #2: KIPP KC Legacy High School will provide continuous education to students, families, and staff about Real World Learning so that they can make informed decisions about student post secondary plans.
- Primary Goal #3: All KIPP Legacy High School students will gain a clear sense of identity, marketable essential skills, community resources and network, and knowledge of their post-secondary options.

Tactics



- Staff professional development
- Expanding our MVA offerings in core courses
- Building and maintaining meaningful partnerships with the community
- Communicating consistently with families about RWL
- Infusing identity work within readiness curriculum
- Collaborating with other charter schools in the region

Fund Reallocation

- Alignment with KIPP Forward funding
- Using band funding
- ACE Network

Financial Feasibility and Sustainability

- Dedicate a portion of charter equity funding
- Strengthen partnerships with business partners to help offset costs of RWL
- Create a specific fundraising campaign for RWL at KIPP
- Advocacy with both the KIPP Foundation and other foundations to fund RWL
- Continue to pool resources with other schools to reach sustainability together
- Collaborate with other charter and district schools to share costs for RWL opportunities
